4. How is the account in vv. 21-29 similar to the defeat of Satan by Jesus spoken of in Col. 2:15; Heb. 2:14?
5. In vv.30-31 God demonstrates His power in delivering Israel. What is the Israel's response and how does it parallel our experience of salvation through Christ?
6. Think of the Exodus experience of Israel in light of our experience of salvation described in Romans 6:1-5. How is our identification with Christ's death burial and resurrection similar to Israel's experience under Moses? See also 1 Cor. 10:1-2.
