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Small Group Questions

REFLECT

1. How many times does the phrase “Because of my/your righteousness” appear in vv.4-6? How does this contribute to the emphasis or theme of the passage? How does the NT emphasize this same theme of human unrighteousness?
2. If the promised land is used in scripture as a metaphor for heaven, then whose righteousness enables us to enter the New Heaven and earth? See Romans 5:17
3. How do v.7 and v.24 bookend the theme of the history of Israel in vv.6-24? What phrase is repeated in each verse? How does this theme coincide with Romans 3:19&20?
4. How does the concept of v.6 find its fulfillment in Romans 5:8? Did Israel have anything to contribute to God bringing them into the land or was it purely a gift of His grace?
5. What was the basis of Moses’ plea on behalf of the people of Israel in vv.27-29?
6. Explain the significance of God redoing the 10 commandments. Why would He do this?
7. Is there any indication that God changed the commands to accommodate Israel’s sin nature in v.4? What does that say to us about adjusting aspects of the Gospel message, like sin and Hell, to make it less offensive?
8. What did God ultimately do to help Israel (and us) with our inability to keep His commands? See Romans 3:21-24
