REFLECT

1. Consider v. 12 -How can we both fear and love God at the same time?
2. Compare our text with Micah 6:8. How does Micah summarize and apply this passage?
3. Read Romans 2:29 and Colossians 2:11. 1 Cor. 7:19. What do these passages say about circumcision and how does it relate to our text In Deuteronomy? Interestingly, the people who had come out of Egypt and disobeyed God had been circumcised. But the generation that Moses is speaking to had not—yet they obeyed. (See Joshua 5:4-7) What does this say about the value of circumcision to bring about holiness?
4. The Text in Colossians implies heart circumcision is done by Christ but in Deuteronomy it suggests Israel needed to circumcise their own hearts. How do you explain the seeming contradiction?
5. Of all the signs God could have used, why do you think He chose circumcision? Why not a tattoo or a nose ring?
6. Read vv.18-19. Why does God put such emphasis on the marginalized? How do we often miss this? How can we get better at ministering to people on the margins? What are some struggles you face in committing to this?
7. Note the word “therefore” at the beginning of Chpt. 11. Explain why v.22 is so important to Moses’ conclusion in 11:1.
