4. What was to motivate slave holders to be gracious in the release of debt-slaves? See v.15. How should this same motivation apply to how we treat the disadvantaged and needy?
5. What are some excuses we often make for not helping the disadvantaged?
6. Does v.11 suggest we should judge whether or not people deserve help?
7. How does the overall emphasis of the text affirm having soft hearts and open hands in ministering to the disadvantaged? See 1Tim.6:17-19


