RELATE

What is your biggest struggle when it comes to prayer?

REFLECT

1. Read the parallel account of this story found in Matthew and Mark's Gospel. (Mark 9:14-29; Matthew 17:14-22) What are some of the differences between Matthew, Mark and Luke's account? Why do you suppose Luke's is so much shorter? What may Luke be trying to emphasize?
2. All of the Gospel writers follow the story of the transfiguration with the story of the demon-possessed boy. Why? How do these two stories go together?
3. Why would Jesus follow up the account of the demon possessed boy with another statement about His coming crucifixion in v.44? Did his disciples believe Him the first time?
4. The disciples were seemingly powerless to deal with the boy's condition. Between the three Gospel accounts what seems to be the reason for their defeat?
