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Small Group Questions

1. How do you think this man with the dropsy ended up at the feast? Did he just happen to drop in?
2. Were the Pharisees genuinely concerned about his physical welfare, or were they looking for something else? What exactly was Jesus “responding” to in v.3 since no one had spoken?
3. Why did the Pharisees remain “silent” in v.4 and why were they unable to “answer” Jesus in v.6?
4. What did Jesus notice in v.7? And who were the people that generally sat next to the host?
5. Kingdom principles are often opposite from the world's. What spiritual principle does Jesus highlight in v.11? See also Psalm 7:6-7, Daniel 4:37, 1 Peter 5:5. Can you think of any other “inverted” kingdom principles? See 2 Cor. 12:9-10, Luke 13:30, Luke 9:24.
6. Is Jesus telling us to never invite our friends and family over for dinner? To whom is he directing our attention to in vs.12-14? Do you think God notices our acts of generosity and kindness? See Mat 10:42, 1 Cor. 4:5.
7. The man in v.15 assumed that he and his friends were going to be in the Kingdom. Do any of us “deserve” to be in the Kingdom of heaven? When Jesus responded with the parable in vs. 16-24 He was talking about the 2nd and final invitation the day of the meal. What invitation is Jesus referring to in v.17? Who was He eluding to when He spoke about those who rejected the invitation in vs.18-20? And who are the people who accepted the invitation in v.21?
8. v.24, What banquet was Jesus referring to when He said “my supper”? Rev19:9.

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
