1. Name the 3 different interrogations that took place in this text.
2. What accusations did the High Priest Caiaphas, and his witnesses bring against Jesus? (See also Luke 23:2) Were they able to find any wrongdoing against Him? V55-60.
3. Only once in His first trial does Jesus break His silence (14:62) What is the significance of His answer to the high priest's question?
4. What does Peter do as Jesus predicted (14:66-72)? What is the connection between Peter's failure and Jesus' death?
5. How does our understanding of the significance of Jesus' first trial with respect to His death, impact us? Explain what happened and its significance.
6. Why was the religious charge of 'blasphemy' changed to a political charge? 15:2.
7. Barabbas is guilty, yet forgiven. Jesus is innocent, yet condemned. What is the significance of this for Jesus' death? How does this impact us? Romans 5:8; 1 Peter 3:18.
8. Why was Peter forgiven while Judas was not forgiven? 2 Cor 7:10. Define godly grief versus worldly grief or sorrow.

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
