I John 2:15-17

- 1) THE DANGER OF THE WORLD
  - A) Loving God means putting Him \_\_\_\_\_ in our lives.

4. How would you define each of these aspects of the 'world'? How does the account of the first temptation in Eden in Genesis 3 compare to this?
5. In what way does the world exercise its hold over us? Why is the world so hard to resist? (I John 2:16, Ephesians 2:1-3)
6. Is it possible for Christians to love God and love the world? (James 4:4)
7. What are the two fundamental problems with the world according to this passage? What two things must we bear in mind when we feel the pull of the world?
8. What is the most powerful antidote to 'love of the world'? (Romans 5:5-8)
9. What encouragement does this passage give us in our fight against the pull of this world?

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
