3. What is the command that Jesus gives? What was a mina equivalent to in wages? What does it signify that each person was given the same amount?
4. Why were the first two servants so eager to report back to the nobleman in v.16 and 18? What were their gains (in percentage) worth respectively? And what exactly did they discover? (1 Tim 2:13, Mark 4:26-28)
5. The first servant was given 10 cities as a reward, and the second servant five cities. (v.17, 19) Were these rewards proportionate to their investments? How might this inspire our own attitude and involvement in the Kingdom of God/Church?
